

Eviction Policy – Stable Events

Issued by National Game Fair Ltd / Stable Events

National Game Fair Ltd and Stable Events are committed to delivering safe and enjoyable events for all attendees. Our event licences are issued under strict terms to uphold public safety, prevent disorder, and minimise nuisance.

Any attendee who breaches these terms may be subject to **immediate eviction** from the site. Eviction decisions will be made at the discretion of the **Head of Operations** or **Managing Director**, following consultation with security staff and managed by the **Security Coordinator** and **Campsite Manager**.

Grounds for Eviction

A person may be evicted from the site for any of the following reasons:

- Entering or being present onsite without a valid ticket, pass, or wristband
- Unacceptable, disruptive, or anti-social behaviour (see below)
- Being arrested or cautioned for a criminal offence (either before or after handover to police)

Examples of unacceptable behaviour include, but are not limited to:

- Any illegal activity
- Breach of the Terms & Conditions of entry
- Offensive or abusive conduct
- Inciting others to engage in disruptive behaviour
- Interfering with security, medical, or emergency operations
- Committing a criminal offence, whether or not police are involved
- Any behaviour that could lead to legal liability for the event organisers or compromise public safety

Eviction Procedure

All evictions will be managed through the on-site **Security Team** and processed by an independent **Ejection Team**, separate from the main security staff. The following steps will apply:

1. Assessment & Interview

Any individual flagged for eviction will be interviewed by the Ejection Team.

- Full details will be recorded including name, photograph, date/time, and reason for ejection.

2. Communication

- Evictees will be offered a telephone call (free of charge) if they do not have access to a mobile phone, to contact their group or family.

3. Collection of Belongings

- Individuals will not be allowed back into the event to collect belongings.
- They must arrange for a friend or group member to retrieve items on their behalf.
- The organiser is not responsible for any belongings left behind.

4. Ticket Revocation & Site Ban

- Tickets will be cancelled to prevent re-entry.
- No re-entry, substitute tickets, or refunds will be issued.

5. Vulnerable Individuals

- If the evictee is vulnerable or under the influence of alcohol or substances, welfare considerations will be taken into account, and additional measures may be applied at the organiser's discretion.
